

“Make Every Effort”...continued

Do results always depend on our effort? I don't think so. I certainly tried to remedy my problems, but others were involved, too. Others' calendars, others' inventories, simple errors, and just nature can derail the best of plans.

What does God say about results? Is He always interested in results? Or is He more interested in the process? Rick Warren says, “God is more interested in your character than your comfort. God is more interested in making your life holy than He is in making it happy.” What does that have to do with my problems with household things? All that is just stuff. God may hear my prayers and allow those things to be resolved, but He is much more interested in how I am making every effort to serve Him. How am I making every effort to share the Gospel? (Matthew 28:19 – “Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit”) How am I making every effort to be kind? (Ephesians 4:32 – “Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you”) How am I making every effort to be holy? (1 Peter 1:16 – “for it is written: “Be holy, because I am holy.”) Do I spend as much effort in pleasing God as I do trying to take care of earthly things?

As we begin the New Year, perhaps it is time to take inventory. What fruit do I have to show for last year? What fruit do I want to cultivate in the coming year? What effort will I make to see that my plans are God's plans? And what effort will I make to see them to completion? Our list should include steps to holiness. God has laid out the plan. We need to walk in it.

“Make Every Effort”

MISSIONS, March 2020

As the overall church mission of Middle River Friends Church is “Exalting Jesus Christ by being fruitful disciple-makers, Expressing God’s love by serving all people, the Missions Committee has the responsibility to promote and inspire the spirit of foreign and home missions, sponsor programs relating to the message of a shared gospel with people of the world, and allocate yearly budgeted funds from the Monthly Meeting to the various mission projects, primarily under the umbrella of sponsorship of Friends. Our Missions Committee Budget for 2020 is \$12,000.

During the last two weeks I have had several individuals ask me how Middle River Friends Church is serving local missions. This is a very valid and valuable question for our committee and our church to ask. Most of you are aware of the many foreign missionaries our church has supported over the years in addition to programs at Quakerdale and Camp Quaker Heights. During the last three years through the generosity of Monthly Meeting we are able to expand and increase support for local missions that serve people in our area. As you see from the budget below we will be supporting Mesquakie Friends, the Salvation Army, and Hope Ministries. We also will be supporting the evangelistic goal of our church through the Come 2020 initiative. A portion of the budget can be used to support other local initiatives as they may present themselves during the year.

2020 Missions Committee Budget (approved October 23, 2019)
Local Missions: Mesquakie (\$500), Quakerdale (\$500), Camp Quaker Heights (\$1,000), Salvation Army (\$400), Hope Ministries (\$500), and MRF Evangelism (\$1,000).

FUM Missions: Friends Theological College (\$500), J. Murou (\$525).
EFM Missions: EFM (\$2,000), Aguascalientes, Mexico (\$1,000), B. Carpenter, Burundi/Rwanda (\$1,200), Adikhari (\$600), Tamang, Bhutan (\$700), Twaddle’s, Philippines (\$600). OMF Int’l: Martins, Cambodia, (\$475). Other Missions: As need arises (\$500)

Through the use of these funds the work of the Lord continues supported by all of our prayers.
